



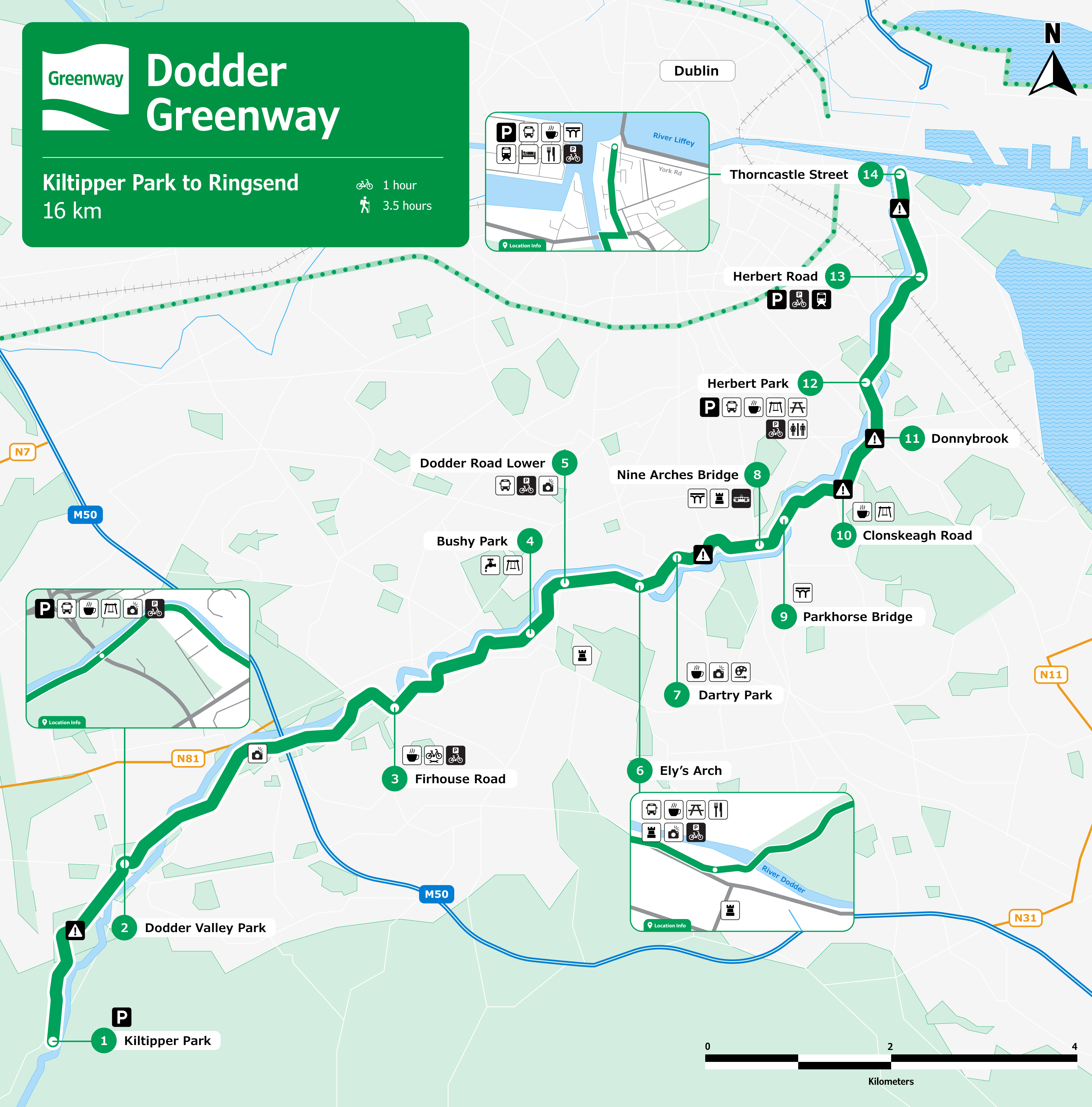
Dodder Greenway

Kiltipper Park to Ringsend

16 km

 3.5 hours



1-2

Kiltipper Park to Dodder Valley Park

5.5 km

Beginning at Kiltipper Park, travel through the park and exit onto Kiltipper Road. Continue along this shared traffic street before reaching the Old Bawn Road. Cross the road to enter Dodder Valley Park. Travel through the park for the next 3.5km passing under the M50 and continue to cycle adjacent to the river until you exit the park onto the Firhouse Road.

2-7

Dodder Valley Park to Ely's Arch

4 km

At Firhouse Road, a cycleway and footpath run alongside the road, separated by a kerb. Turn left onto Kilvere Road and, after approximately 200 metres, rejoin the off road route via an access point. Shortly after passing under a bridge, exit onto Dodder View Road where a cycle lane and footpath run alongside the road, separated by a kerb. On reaching Dodder Road Lower you will pass a weir before arriving at Ely's Arch.

7-12

Ely's Arch to Donnybrook

3.8 km

Cross a narrow bridge into Orwell Park and continue into Darty Park. A short, moderately steep section leads to Milltown Road, which has a footpath but no cycle lane, followed by a noticeable descent. Rejoin the off road route at the Dropping Well pub and pass under Classon Bridge into Shanagarry Park.

Cross the Dodder at Packhorse Bridge, continue through a public park, then exit onto Beech Hill Road. This 1-kilometre section has a narrow footpath and no cycle lanes. On joining the Stillorgan road, a cycle lane is available to use briefly before crossing the road to access the off-road section commencing beside Donnybrook stadium

12-15

Donnybrook to Ringsend

3 km

Follow the path between the river and the rear of Donnybrook Stadium, continuing through Herbert Park. Exit onto Merrion Road and proceed along Beatty's Avenue, a quiet street with a footpath but no cycle lane. After a short distance, rejoin an off road route passing under the railway line.

You will again join an offroad route which crosses under the railway line via a narrow underpass. Passing by the Avivia stadium, you will exit on to Londonbridge Road – this road has a cycle lane and a foot path separated from the road by a kerb. The final section of your journey is a short section to the Tom Clarke Bridge via Thorncastle road – there is a pavement but no cycle lanes on this quiet road.
