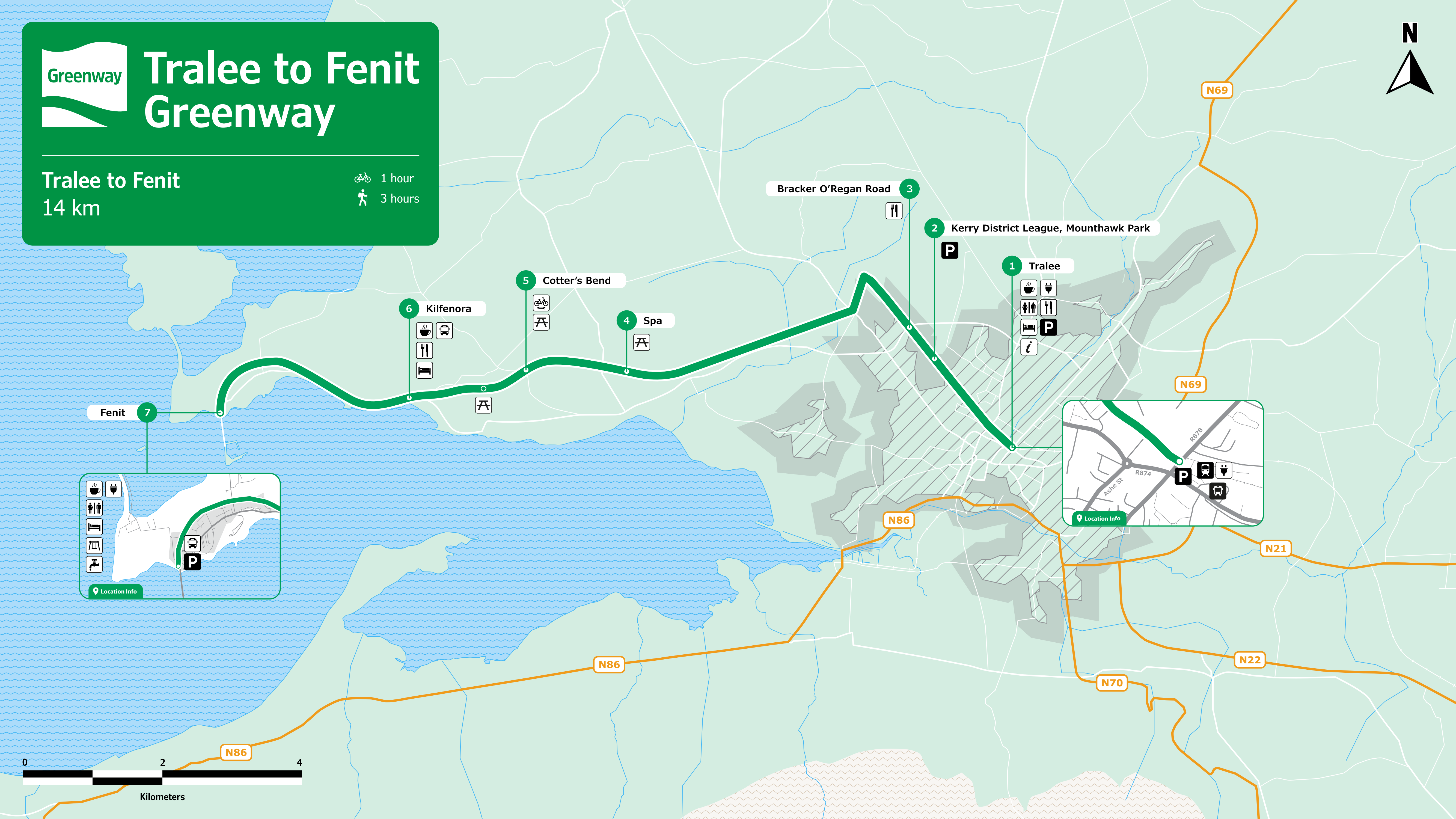
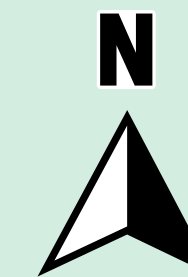




# Tralee to Fenit Greenway

## 1-5 Tralee to Cotter's Bend

8.6 km

Starting beside Casement railway station in Tralee, a large sign spans the entrance to the greenway located adjacent to the R878. Please take care at the road crossings and junctions along the initial section of the route. Car parking is available at Mounthawk Park, located approximately 1.5km from the starting point.

Beyond the town, the greenway opens into farmland and hedgerows with distant views of the Slieve Mish mountain range. Please be respectful of local farmers who may be moving livestock across the route. Further along, Cotter's Bend acts as a natural midpoint to take a break before continuing your journey

## 5-7 Cotter's Bend to Fenit

5 km

The route gradually brings you closer to the coastline. The approach to Fenit is particularly scenic, with sweeping views of Tralee Bay and its islands. A range of marine habitats including mudflats, estuaries, rocky seashores, sand dunes fringe the bay, and the air is filled with seabird calls. The greenway concludes at the Harbour – the facility centre offers hot showers, changing areas, toilets, secure storage, equipment washdown areas, and a changing places facility with a playground and cafes nearby.

You can opt to continue your journey by relaxing on the beach or stroll for approximately 750 metres along the pier before climbing the steps to the 3.6-metre-high bronze statue of Saint Brendan the Navigator located on Great Sampire Island. The sixth-century saint, patron saint of mariners was born in Fenit in 484AD and has strong connections to the area.
